OLD BUSH VINE GRENACHE ROSÉ

Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. 'The Château' is an Australian heritage icon whose grand buildings, magnificent gardens and prime vineyards are owned by the Geber family who continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

Vineyard

The Château Old Vine Grenache Rosé is made from grapes grown by the Gobell family in the Stonewell sub region of the Barossa Valley.

Winemaking

After just three hours skin contact, the free-run juice was fermented at low temperature for two weeks in stainless steel to retain the wines character, freshness and purity.

Tasting note

Delightful pale pink in colour, this dry rosé takes its inspiration from the Provençale rosés of Southern France. This wine shows subtle red berry fruit flavours and a mouth-watering refreshing acidity with a long lingering finish. A truly elegant wine.
