Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of the first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The Château is an Australian heritage icon whose grand buildings, magnificent gardens and prime vineyards are owned by the Geber family who continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

Vineyard

For this year's blend we selected grapes grown in the Barossa sub-regions of Bethany, Ebenezer, Greenock, Seppeltsfield, Tanunda and Vine Vale. It is this tapestry of 'terroirs' which enables us to faithfully recreate one of the Barossa's original wine styles. This synergistic trio seamlessly combines the elegance, power and structure only achievable in a blended wine.

Tasting note

Lifted aromas of blackberry, black cherry and raspberry are accompanied by spicy, dark berry fruits and white pepper on the palate. The finish is long with fine-grained tannins from two years' maturation in a combination of new and seasoned American and French oak barrels.

Although drinking well now the wine will benefit from medium-term cellaring.
